Advanced Language and Culture

All courses take place at London Metropolitan University, Holloway Road campus. It is right next to a Piccadilly Line tube station, which takes you to Holborn, central London in 8 mins, and a 10-minute walk from Highbury and Islington, which is on the Victoria line and has a range of overground services. Course Outline

This course is aimed at teachers and language learners with a level of English of C1 or C2. It will give you the confidence and familiarity with current issues, media representations, stereotypes, cultural and political figures and recent events in Britain. Material and tasks are more adult and appropriate for university-level students or simply for your own pleasure and language learning! The course combines discussions, lectures, different media and visits within London on the connected themes

Content

We will provide a questionnaire for participants before they arrive to express preferences or make requests which we will try to incorporate into the course if possible and where there is agreement between participants. This means specific content will vary from course to course. Some topics you might cover are:

Class Housing, regeneration and gentrification Common UK cultural stereotypes / cities Youth issues UK economy and business trends Hipster culture and influence Drinking and drug culture Comedy and cultural insights Comedy and language – catch phrases and types Immigration Multicultural Britain Religion Moments in recent history Influential people in the UK Health service Sport and sporting clichés Education Language - new words, idioms and colloquialisms Family trends and relationships Gay cultural influence Women in UK society TV programmes and influence UK Media and Music Modern literature and stories

After this course participants will:

- be more comfortable in their knowledge of contemporary UK culture
- be better able to deal with cultural references in conversation
- be more able to understand colloquial language
- be aware of a variety of internet resources and writers for study beyond the course
- go away with some material they can use in adult or university classes
- know London better
