This is a practical, active and interactive course that explores current trends in English, provides opportunities for language development and practice and presents practical ideas and techniques for teaching language. You will learn up-to-date idiomatic and colloquial English, explore how the current cultural climate is affecting English and be more aware of changes in English pronunciation and grammar. You will also experience a variety of effective teaching strategies, activities and techniques that you can use with your own students in your own classroom.

This course is for:

- Experienced teachers with an advanced (C1) language level or above.
- Participants with a high existing level of English who want to improve and update their language and their classroom practice.
- Participants who want to know about new trends and changes in modern English usage.

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What you will gain by attending the course:

- Increased awareness of recent changes and developments in English grammar, vocabulary and pronunciation.
- Improved English language competencies, including a greater knowledge of idiomatic and colloquial language.
- Greater awareness of a range of techniques and strategies for presenting and practising new language.
- Opportunities to develop and disseminate innovative teacher practice internationally

Course content

This course will cover some or all of the following topics:

- How English is affected by the cultural climate
- Language, gender and political correctness
- Lexical change and development: where new words come from and how they are formed
- Grammar change and the implications for teaching
- Slang, contemporary phrasal verbs and idioms
- Pronunciation: from RP to the English of the future
- Exploiting authentic materials for learning activities
