Performance Projects are delivered in a workshop format to multi-level teams.

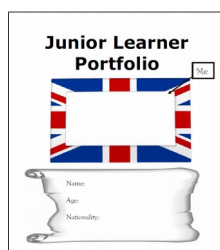

All English - Exam

Our exam preparation programme fully prepares each student for every aspect of their chosen exam and enables them to use grammar and syntax more effectively to ensure each student achieves the exam results they need. We also help to build confidence to help reduce pre exam nerves. Cambridge exam students can take their exam on site at the end of their course.

After the afternoon lessons, students join an Active Session of their choice, perhaps Sports and Health, Music and Performing Arts, or Art and Design.

The course includes 21 hours of structured English learning sessions (11 hrs Exam English, 10 hrs English Skills and Structure), plus 6 hrs of interest based activities; evening events every night; 1½ day excursion per week.

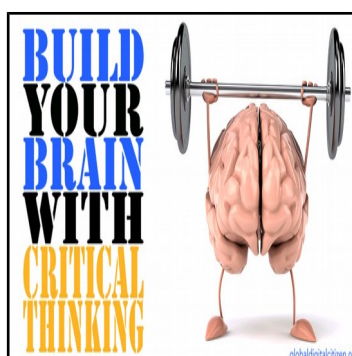

Regent Stowe Excursion

About Oxford

Oxford is a historic city with a unique and interesting history for visitors to explore. The city is famous for its prestigious university and beautiful buildings, including the Radcliffe Camera, Bridge of Sighs and Christ Church College to name just a few. Oxford also has a strong literary tradition, inspiring authors such as C.S. Lewis, Lewis Carroll and J.R.R. Tolkien.

Walking tour

Our walking tour of Oxford takes students through the city, visiting some of the university colleges. Included in this is the famous Bodleian library, which is home to around 11 million printed items and was used in the Harry Potter films. Students enjoy their lunch by the side of the river, watching the traditional punting in this famous location.



Museums

Oxford is home to many museums, each holding many interesting artefacts. Students enjoy visiting the Ashmolean, Natural History and Pitt Rivers Museums. Students go on a scavenger hunt to find as many items from their list as they can helping them to explore the museum in a way that promotes creativity and engagement.

Excursion English

Students are given a list of landmarks to research & find during their excursion. They need to be resourceful and use their English to find these locations by asking locals for directions, reading local signs and navigating themselves as a team. Students are required to take a photo of themselves at the desired location and points are awarded for both efficiency and creativity.

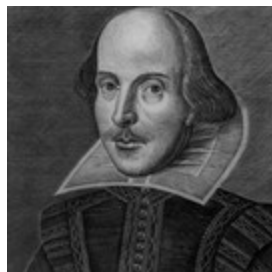
Stratford-Upon-Avon *Regent Stowe Excursion*

About Stratford-Upon-Avon

This market town was built in 1196 on a medieval grid system and has many historical and cultural treasures. In the 16th century the town was home to England's best known playwright William Shakespeare. Today his place of birth is world-famous.

Shakespeare Tour

Students discover the five houses connected to Shakespeare in Stratford-Upon-Avon including his birthplace and his wife's childhood home. Students learn about Shakespeare's life, but also about the time in which he lived, the Elizabethan period, named after the queen of the time.



Butterfly Farm

Stratford Upon Avon Butterfly Farm is the UK's largest tropical free flying butterfly house. Students learn about the wonderful English countryside here. There are also handling sessions when students can meet other animals such as snakes and stick insects.

Excursion English

Students test their skills in Elizabethan English by reciting Shakespeare quotes. There is a list of quotes that relate to various locations on the excursion, saying the quote at each place in a theatrical manner. These videos are then presented in the lesson on the following Monday. Points are rewarded for the most authentic presentation style.

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LONDON *Regent Stowe Excursion*

About London

The capital city of England has been long regarded as one of the best cities in the world. London is home to the Queen, the Houses of Parliament and some of the best tourist attractions on the world. With over 30 million visitors a year, this city has something for everyone to enjoy. We ensure students get to experience some of the diversity and local opportunities as well as the usual tourist attractions.



Exploring the Natural History Museum

Students discover this landmark museum in the heart of London. Holding hundreds of exhibits at a time, this museum is sure to excite all visitors. Highlights include the world famous dinosaur gallery as well as the mammal gallery, with its full size model blue whale along with thousands of other interesting items. After here we usually enjoy lunch at one of London's many parks.

Covent Garden's Street Performers

Watch some of the most skilled and interesting street performers in the famous Covent Garden near London's West-End Shows throughout the day will include dancing, music and magic. Covent Garden is an iconic part of London. In addition, students will stroll through the streets of the city, visiting world famous landmarks at every turn in our guided walking tour.

Time to use their English

Students are set a challenge on their trip to London. In teams, students persuade locals and visitors to answer survey questions they create in class prior to the trip. They take these answers to compare the two perspectives (visitor/local) and create a presentation of their findings on the following Monday. It's a great way for students to see the city's landmarks and use English in a real life context at the same time.

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CAMBRIDGE *Regent Stowe Excursion*

About Cambridge

Cambridge is perhaps most famous for its world-class university but it has much more than this to offer its visitors. The local Fitzwilliam museum has a wealth of interesting art and artefacts on display, plus there is a lot to explore and discover in the local countryside.

University tour

Cambridge university is made up of 31 colleges! Students enjoy learning interesting facts about many of these colleges on our Cambridge walking tour. Students will learn about famous former students including royalty, authors, performers, artists and sports stars.



Rural Cambridge

The cathedral city of Ely has a rich history, which students investigate. This includes visits to the cathedral and Gog Magog Downs where there is a lot to explore. The downs are home to British wildlife and flowers; an ancient Roman road runs right through it so you can retrace the steps of early Britons.

Excursion English

We challenge our students to find out about interesting facts about the Cambridge colleges including when they were built and if any of the colleges have interesting former students. Students also ask Cambridge which colleges are their favourites and why. Back in the school students present their findings to their class.
