Target audience

• Experienced native and non-native teachers who teach young adults (aged 15+) and adults.

You will need at least an intermediate level of English (B1).

Course summary

This is a very practical course for teachers of English who have to use a course book in their work but believe that teaching does not have to depend on it. There are many advantages in teaching with fewer or no materials: firstly, the teacher utilizes the people in the group as their principal resource, which means that the main focus is on them. Secondly, the input is not mediated, and the students are the main protagonists of the learning process. Thirdly, it pushes the teacher to explore more creative approaches in their classroom. Finally, you spend less time preparing and photocopying when preparing for your class; instead you come up with creative ideas which may be publishable. This course also provides a large amount of English practice throughout.

Preparation

Each applicant needs to send a Teacher's Profile four weeks before the course outlining hopes and objectives for achievement as a result of attending this course.

Objectives

This course will focus on the teacher's skills and creativity to plan and teach a lesson with minimum or no resources.

Expected results

As a result of attending this course, the participants will be more creative professionals who will be able to design lessons that are refreshing, challenging and effective. You may develop ways of thinking that will benefit you and your class. Who knows... you may discover you want to publish your ideas and share them with other teachers.
